Minutes of the Previous Meeting

A motion was made by Mike and seconded by Justin to accept the June council meeting minutes. Motion carried.

Financial Report and Approval of Bills

A motion was made by Peter and seconded by Matt to transfer \$40,000 from the Kaiser Fund to the General Fund to cover payment for the parking lot improvements and new electronic sign (pending congregational approval). Motion carried.

A motion was made by Peter and seconded by Justin to approve the June financial reports. Motion carried.

Worship

Pastor Steve reminded the council about the outdoor worship service and picnic on Sunday, 8/14 at Taylor Park. Siera and potentially the choir will provide special music.

The council agreed to conduct altar communion the next couple months.

Safety and Security

Peter reminded the council the back doors of the sanctuary leading to the Narthex should remain open during worship. An usher can then keep an eye on the carport door during service should anyone walk in during service.

It was reported that someone came into the church during the last TOPPS meeting looking for assistance and/or food. This was afterhours when the office was closed. The council decided that we post a notice at the doors to inform people of the office hours and the contact if assistance is needed. A motion was made by Justin and seconded by Peter that anytime there is no staff or council members present, doors must remain locked. Motion carried. This should be added to the form for new groups. We need to ensure this is communicated to all church groups.

Mike will research security camera systems.

Activities Assistant

Reviewed report from Brenda Roehl.

Pastor Steve added that Brenda is working on setting up someone to hold a presentation on human trafficking.

Faye brought up an idea for a car show in the parking lot for church members.

Pastoral Care

Pastor Steve reported he is making more visits. The Visitation Team is also able to make more visits.

Christian Education

Pastor Steve reported that no one signed up for Vacation Bible School. Next year we need to start the sign-up earlier.

Sunday School teachers organized and decorated the rooms yesterday.

Fellowship Hour

The coffee maker will be unplugged during the week, so the water does not evaporate. Norberto will plug it in Sunday mornings.

### Groups in the Church Family

Ladies of Peace: Taking the summer off.

Martha's Society: No update.

Golden Fellowship: Faye provided an update. Movie planned.

Youth: Pastor Steve reported the confirmation class is coming in for one-on-one meetings. Also, the last Sunday in September the youth group meets. They are in need of a group leader.

### Outreach

Loaves and Fishes: It was reported that around 150 people were served yesterday and about 180 at the previous one.

OCWM: No update.

River Park: Victor reported there was no meeting scheduled for July.

Food Pantry: No update.

### Stewardship Ministry Team

Matt reported on the team's last meeting, noting they are preparing for the 8/14 outdoor worship at Taylor Park. The Dock Spiders outing was well attended. The next meeting has been pushed back to 8/2 at which time they will finalize plans for the outdoor worship service. A flyer has been created and will be posted throughout the church.

### Church Administration

Business advertising in the bulletin was discussed again and the council agreed to not allow it at the current time. This will need to be part of a larger conversation in the future.

Special Congregational Meeting is scheduled for Sunday, 7/24 to vote on the purchase of the outdoor electronic sign and to seek feedback on whether to hire people to visit members for pledges as part of the capital campaign or have volunteers from within the church do so.

It was noted the Garden Club would like to hold their district meeting in the fellowship hall on 10/5. We need Jackie Rymer to obtain more information on the timeframe to ensure someone is here to open and lock the doors.

### Building and Grounds

Courtyard: Victor reported he needs to find help to finish this as there will be some heavy lifting and hauling.

Bats: No further issues to anyone's knowledge.

Lights in sanctuary: Peter will contact Leasa Electric regarding a light out under the stairs and in the sanctuary.

Pastor Steve reported on behalf of Pat S., the platform by the organ may need to be extended as it is a safety issue.

Pastor Steve reported that the fire department conducted their inspection yesterday and there were no violations.

### Capital Campaign

Spaghetti dinner: 25 people attended the meeting, meal was delicious, and Justin's presentation was great. Justin noted he would like feedback on defining a successful capital campaign. He also needs help with seeking feedback from the congregation and reaching out for grants.

Justin will respond to Jill White's inquiry regarding proceeding with the campaign.

### Comments of the Council President

Victor commented that he has only heard good things from the congregation.

### Comments of the Pastor

Pastor Steve suggested moving away from streaming worship services on Facebook Live. The typical watch time averages about 5 minutes. He asked the council to think about switching to YouTube and post it later on Facebook. The switch will happen gradually if we decide to change.

Financial Report and Approval of Bills

A motion was made by Justin and seconded by Matt to approve the July financial reports. Motion carried.

Worship

Pastor Steve reminded the council about the outdoor worship service and picnic at Taylor Park on Sunday 8/14 at 10:00am.

The council supports allowing the congregation to move around during the Passing of Christ's Peace. Pastor Steve reported that viewers can now make comments when watching the worship service on YouTube.

Safety and Security

Mike reported that he researched security camera systems. Costs could be between \$1,500 to \$2,000 for a centralized hub with options for viewing remotely and hard wired or Wi-Fi with batteries. An app would need to be downloaded. He will continue to investigate options including costs for the next meeting.

Activities Assistant

Reviewed report from Brenda Roehl. The applicable council members filled in their info on the contact list that Brenda created.

Pastoral Care

Pastor Steve reported he conducted the funeral service for Hollie Hanson. He is still making visits.

Christian Education

Pastor Steve reported Sunday School will be held once per month. There are plans to hold Family Fun Day every month and the youth group will meet once per month.

Groups in the Church Family

Ladies of Peace: Faye reported the group held their annual picnic at Buttermilk Creek Park.

Martha's Society: No update.

Golden Fellowship: Faye mentioned the movie went over well. The next get-together will include a presentation from a representative of the Salvation Army.

Youth: Pastor Steve mentioned the group will meet on the fourth Sunday in September.

Bazaar: Victor referred to the group's meeting minutes and mentioned the Swiss Steak meal planned for 9/20 from 4pm – 7pm.

## Outreach

Loaves and Fishes: Victor commented that it has been going well. The next time Church of Peace serves is 8/31.

OCWM: Recent collections will go toward the flooding victims in Kentucky.

River Park: Victor reported on the last meeting noting that a new pavilion will be built in Hamilton Park along with water features. Also discussed was the redevelopment of the old casket factory on Brooke Street.

Food Pantry: Pastor Steve inquired about raising the number of times per year a person/family can obtain food from our food pantry. A motion was made by Justin and seconded by Mike to change the food pantry give away frequency to once/month. Motion carried.

## Stewardship Ministry Team

Matt reported on the team's last meeting, noting they continued preparation for the outdoor worship at Taylor Park. They also started to look ahead at future Stewardship events.

## Church Administration

Pastor Steve shared his thoughts on how we lead the church.

During congregational meetings, the council agreed that we need to follow the rules of order. Additionally in the future, ballots shall be handed out when the meeting starts. Before the next congregational meeting, it would be a good idea for the council to stand up front and ask people to stay for the meeting as we have had difficulty obtaining a quorum of 35 people. A motion was made by Mike and seconded by Brian to nullify the vote that occurred at the special congregational meeting on 7/24 due to the lack of a quorum. Motion carried.

Outdoor sign decision: A motion was made by Mike and seconded by Justin to table discussion until the next meeting or after Pastor Steve obtains more info on the least agreement vs buy-out. Motion carried.

The council agreed to allow Norbert to reduce his hours by 4 hours per week. We may need to find someone to help fill in.

At the next council meeting, we will revisit the once/year communion requirement that was lifted due to COVID.

Mike will look into Jackie Rymer's pension.

## Building and Grounds

Courtyard: Victor reported he still needs help to finish this as there will be heavy lifting and hauling.

Pastor Steve reported the lights in the sanctuary have been fixed.

Pastor Steve reported on the visit from the chemical supplier. A chemical dispenser has been installed. They can also rent burnishers/buffers for the floors.

## Capital Campaign

The council agreed to table discussion regarding the next informational meeting until the next council meeting.

Meeting adjourned at 8:21 PM with the Lord's Prayer.

The next council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, September 13, 2022, at 6:30 PM.

100 years ago there was 1taufen (baptism) in September, a daughter Doris to M/M Ed and Alice Quade on Sept. 3.

90 years ago the taufen of Roma Mae, daughter of M/M Albert and Alma Grahl was held on Sept. 18, 1932.

80 years ago the taufen of 3 babies occurred in Sept. 1942 – John, son of Douglas and Christine McCrary; James, son of Oscar and Dora Kimpel; and Lester, son of Lester and Marian Abitz.

60 years ago the record book was in English and in Sept. 1962 5 baptisms were performed for Pattie Ann, daughter of Jerome and Mary Lou Meisner; William, son of Richard and Marion Schoonover; Craig, son of Gordon and Helen Rose; Laura, daughter of Lorenz and Jeanette Hansel; and Kay, daughter of Edward and Marilyn Schultz.
