COUNCIL MINUTES from the September 13, 2022
(minutes taken by Matt Moore)

Balance as of August 1, 2022: \$35,459.26

Deposits in August: \$14,960.05

Disbursements in August: \$15,697.90

Balance as of August 31, 2022: \$34,721.41

Minutes of the Previous Meeting

A motion was made by Justin and seconded by Peter to accept the August council meeting minutes. Motion carried.

Financial Report and Approval of Bills

A motion was made by Peter and seconded by Bobbi to transfer \$15,000 from the general fund back to the Kaiser Memorial fund. Motion carried.

A question came up on Jackie Rymer's retirement fund. Mike mentioned this was delayed due to paperwork that has to be completed. The paperwork has been sent to the church for Jackie to complete. A motion was made by Justin and seconded by Peter to pay both 2021 and 2022's payments in October. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Peter and seconded by Faye to approve the August financial reports. Motion carried.

Worship

The council discussed a parishioner's concern regarding switching worship service live streams from Facebook to YouTube. No changes will be made regarding Facebook for the time being. We have been using YouTube already.

There will be two worship services on Christmas Eve (4 and 6 PM) and one on Sunday Christmas Day.

A motion was made by Justin and seconded by Peter to hold the Christmas Day service at 10 AM with communion.

Safety and Security

Mike reviewed the security camera system. The cost would be approximately \$1,000 for up to 10 cameras plus installation and cat5 or cat6 ethernet cable. A motion was made by Brian and seconded by Peter to move forward with purchasing the 10-camera security system. Motion carried.

Activities Assistant

Pastor Steve reviewed Brenda Roehl's report.

Pastoral Care

Pastor Steve reported he continues to get into more places to make visits.

Christian Education

Sunday School starts next Sunday September 18th.

Fellowship Hour

Diane Reiter asked how things have been going. The council agreed everything has been going well with no issues brought up.

Swiss Steak Meal

Reviewed the report of the committee's last meeting. The meal is planned for September 20th.

Groups in the Church Family

Ladies of Peace: Faye reported on their last meeting. The church rummage sale is scheduled for November 11th and 12th.

Martha's Society: Victor mentioned that the bags for homebound members are ready.

Golden Fellowship: Faye mentioned the next event will be a game day.

Youth: Peter volunteered to lead this group. He reported he met with Pastor Steve to discuss expectations. Jean Stepp also agreed to help.

Outreach

Loaves and Fishes: Jerry reported on last Thursday's board meeting. He mentioned the numbers from June to August have continually increased. They discussed going back to sit down meals inside the church and returning to registration at the same time.

River Park: Victor reported on the last meeting. The main discussion from the police officer in attendance surrounded Fond du Lac's drug problems.

Food Pantry: It was reported that 18 households were helped. May need to reconnect with the pantry in Omro. There has been an uptick in people asking for assistance with food and hotel stays for the homeless.

Stewardship Ministry Team

Matt reported on the team's last meeting. They discussed changes for next year's outdoor service. At their next meeting, they will start working on a calendar of events for 2023.

Church Administration

Pastor Steve added to his thoughts from last month on how we lead the church. Jesus Christ is the center.

The council was asked that for the next council meeting to think about the membership requirement from the church constitution regarding returning for communion and if those attending worship virtually count toward this requirement.

Building and Grounds

Peter reported the quote from Pionke for this winter's snow removal is the same as 2021. A motion was made by Peter and seconded by Faye to stay with Pionke and accept the 2022 proposal. Motion carried.

Floor waxing: The quote from Nassco was reviewed. It contains costs for materials using our floor scrubber for both stripping and waxing. Free training is provided. A motion was made by Peter and seconded by Jerry to accept the quote to purchase materials and purchase leg guards for the tables and chairs. Motion carried.

GFL: The contract needs to be reviewed in detail as it is a 5-year contract. We need to monitor the dumpster capacity to see if we can manage only one pick up every other week – one for waste and one for recyclables. It was agreed to discuss at next month's meeting. The contract needs to be signed by October 22nd.

Bats: Bats have been noticed. We need to contact a professional.

Norbert: Victor volunteered to fill in for the time being.

Capital Campaign

Justin reviewed the Outline and Timetable from the Building to Serve Committee.

Comments of the Council President

Victor asked the council to please find time to help out with the Swiss Steak meal, bazaar, and rummage sale.

Comments of the Pastor

Pastor Steve reported he purchased a new router since the previous one was outdated and causing issues. The council supports the purchase.

Comments of the Council Members

Jerry thanked Pat Siekierke for helping with yard work recently.


Meeting adjourned at 8:55 PM with the Lord's Prayer.

The next council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, October 11, 2022, at 6:30 PM.

Life Line Screening goes beyond regular checkups to look inside your arteries for signs of plaque build-up

Carotid Artery Disease:

An ultrasound is performed to screen the carotid arteries for buildup of fatty plaque.

Peripheral Arterial Disease:

An Ankle-Brachial Index (ABI) test is performed using blood pressure cuffs on the arms and legs.¹

An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm.
