H'S TOUR DAY TO SIT DOME AND CHARLE APPREAMENTS DOME Greetings Sisters and Brothers,

In the grand scheme of things, June is a month of diversity which brings sunshine and moderate temperatures. We can always count on it being cold some evenings and mornings, even some afternoons. We can also count on it being warm and maybe even hot some days.

June is also a month of growth and development for our lawns and gardens. The color of flowers and the deep green of our grass adds a stunning beauty to the landscape of creation. But what about the weeds? The dandelions add a wonderful yellow to contrast with the lawn greens. Not to mention the captivating purple of wild violets scattered against the green landscape. But we all know that if left unchecked, the green of the grass will eventually lose ground to the weeds that infiltrate its ranks. But is our life like that too? Do we need to worry about what we perceive as weeds in the lawn and garden of our lives?

Well, if we listen to the parable Jesus tells in Matthew 13:24-30, we must wonder first, we are qualified to decide what is a weed and what is wheat in our lives? So, Jesus makes it very clear that at the time of harvest, He will decide, not us.

"Jesus told them another parable: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed in his field. But while everyone was sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and went away. When the wheat sprouted and formed heads, then the weeds also appeared. The owner's servants came to him and said, 'Sir, didn't you sow good seed in your field? Where then did the weeds come from?' 'An enemy did this," he replied. The servants asked him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?' 'No,' he answered, 'because while you are pulling the weeds, you may uproot the wheat with them. Let both grow together until the harvest. At that time, I will tell the harvesters: First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles to be burned; then gather the wheat and bring it into my barn.'" (Matthew 13:24-30)

You see, it is very easy for us to say, "he is a bad seed," or "she is a weed." Honestly, most of us have been a weed at some time in our lives, but hopefully now we are wheat. Being wheat also means that we don't call anyone a weed or a bad seed. Instead, we call them a potential seed of faith which can easily become wheat of the harvest if we help cultivate, nourish, and care for our ground where they are planted. Praise be to God!

On June 10, 1932 our new minister, Rev. Karl Koehler, attended his first Church Council meeting. Jacob Brenner (Brenner Tank) was Council President and Ferd Kienow, Secretary.

June, 1963, Vacation Bible School was for 2 weeks with the theme "Walking with God". There were 295 students participating with 27 teachers.

50 years ago in June, 1973 5 year olds thru Confirmation aged attended Vacation Bible School from 9am-2pm, bringing their own sack lunches. The theme was "Tell the News, Share the Love" with Directors Mrs. Nick Roghair and Mrs. Clifford Freiberg leading 225 students.

That same June was the Church/Sunday School Picnic in Taylor Park with 209 free tickets given to our SS students.

40 years ago in June, 1983 Lakeland College Pastor's Scholarship was awarded to Dawn Lennop, daughter of M/M Donald Lennop. She received a \$750 award for her studies at the college.

Also in May/June of '83 the 10:30 liturgy was led by lay church members until an interim pastor could be chosen. Rev. Koehler made birthday housecalls only on the heads of households. (He was continuing studies for his doctorate degree which will be explained next month). We were thankful for the help from Erv Kaiser, Ginny Boyke, Roger Sattler, Sally Freiberg, Gordon McDonald, Joanne Ziebell and Connie Thome.


