Church of Peace Council Meeting Minutes – October 10, 2023

Call to Order: Victor called the meeting to order at 6:34 PM.

Opening Prayer: Pastor Steve led the opening prayer.

Minutes of the Previous Meeting

A motion was made by Bobbi and seconded by Nancy to accept the September council meeting minutes. Motion carried.

Financial Report and Approval of Bills

Bobbi noted the beginning balance on the Abbreviated Financial Report for 9/1/23 doesn't match the 8/31/23 ending balance. This will need to be corrected. Justin reported he will be working on a video review of the 3rd quarter Investing in the Future (formerly Building to Serve) numbers. In support, it was recommended the council attend or take part in the video. Justin reported we may need to use the Endowment Fund to make the minimum building loan payments since giving has reduced. Also, the balance in the General Fund is very low. A motion was made by Justin and seconded by Nancy to move the Malson Memorial and the Air Conditioner Fund into the General Fund. Motion carried. A motion was made by Justin and seconded by Matt to approve the September financials and pay the bills. Motion carried.

Ladies of Peace: Discussed the upcoming Church of Peace Rummage Sale. The council discussed a request to open an E-bay account using COP's tax exemption. E-bay can be used to sell items and generate income for the church. This decision has been tabled until we receive more information.

Golden Fellowship: Faye reported that Renee Kiefer and Jane Carter will be discussing organ donation on Thursday 10/19.

Youth: There were 2 youth members that helped redecorate the Upper Room. Outreach

Loaves & Fishes: Victor reported 98 people were served last night and 122 last week. Reminder that COP serves again on Wednesday 12/13.

River Park: Victor reported the group discussed housing. This group will be changing to their winter schedule (meet every other month).

Food Pantry: 17 households were given food assistance and 7 rent/utility assistance. The Reverse Advent Calendar event in December will help fill the food pantry. Pastor Steve reported we are also looking into a federal program called Feeding America to help keep the pantry stocked but comes with strict guidelines.

Salem UCC in Wayne, WI received a large donation of clothing and winter apparel. They are willing to provide COP with clothing again for our Winter Clothing Rack.

Stewardship Ministry Team: Matt reminded the council of the Crop Walk event happening on Sunday 10/15. The group is planning for that and the upcoming Trunk or Treat on 10/29. They will also be getting ready for the Stewardship Drive, the Angel/Bell Tree, Christmas cards, and coordinating decoration of Christmas cookies for Fellowship Hour between services on Christmas Eve.

Church Administration

Discussion on Pastor's medical and dental coverage will be tabled until next month. This coverage is detailed in the Pastor's call agreement.

Pastor Steve reported he is trying to plan a time to use his remaining vacation.

Wendy Petak, new Office Manager, asked for approval to work extra hours while she is learning as there is a lot yet to learn. A motion was made by Justin and seconded by Faye to approve extra hours for training not to exceed 5 hours per week and the council will review again after 3 weeks. Motion carried. Buildings and Grounds

Victor discussed obtaining quotes for snow removal. He received one from Prima and will request one from Pionke. We will table further discussion until next month's council meeting.

Victor reported that currently there is no maintenance required for the boilers. He is awaiting an estimate to have Maple Valley check it over once or twice per year.

Victor recommended he purchase the security cameras since the previous project has not progressed. He will purchase up to 6 cameras which will be connected wirelessly. The council agreed and approved. Scholarship Pinkert Fund:

The council reviewed the application form.

Pastor Steve challenged the council to think about reducing the grant amount and supplement the difference with a scholarship to help applicants want to increase their involvement in the church.

Constitution review has been scheduled to take place after worship service on 10/22.

Investing in the Future (formerly Building to Serve): discussed in the Financial Report and Approval of Bills section of the agenda.

Comments of the Council President: None

Comments of the Pastor: Mentioned that we've seen a decline in giving since May likely due in part to the one-time giving/matching funds event. We need to remind members to continue giving what they nor-mally give and if able a little more. There may be confusion since there are two issues – a decline in giving to the general fund and a decline in giving to the building loan fund. The Pastor also provided some insight after his Fall Clergy Retreat.

Forty years ago in November 1983, our mission to help the sick and suffering around the world and proclaimed the Good News received a change in names. Our Churches World Mission became OUR CHURCHES WIDER MISSION, with the acronym remaining the same, O.C.W.M.

Sixty years ago in 1963 the Exchange Club in Fond Du Lac started a new service award titled the Book of Golden Deeds Award. Its first recipient was our retiring pastor, Karl Koehler. Annually they hope to recognize a resident for unselfish devotion and dedication to Neighbor and community. Rev. Koehler was described as a "a fervent worker behind the scenes, one who did not want chairmanship of a committee, but rather preferred to be a hard-working committee member, shunning publicity, for what he might do."

Rev. Karl Koehler was listed as a member on the Visiting Nurse Assoc. board of directors, past officer and member of every committee of the FDL Ministerial Assoc. sponsor of the religious instruction project at Taycheedah Prison, helping the needy of the community and supporting the Big Brothers' program, and former Santa Pals. He was instrumental in establishing the Youth Center, Golden Agers Club, and a supporter of the surplus food program for the needy. He largely founded the St. Mark's UCC Church in FDL.

His son, Rev. Martin and wife were ushered into the room to be with him, and his wife when he was presented a plaque and certificate. In response, he humbly expressed his gratitude and cited the many achievements of the Exchange Club.
