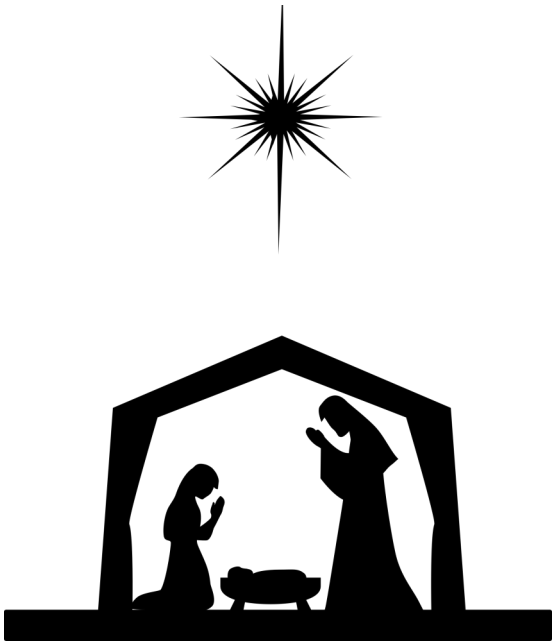

Church of Peace Council Meeting Minutes – November 14, 2023

Present: Pastor Stephen Stepp, Jerry Johnson, Victor Abitz, Nancy Pahnke, Matt Moore, Bobbi Thomma, Justin Poirer

Absent: Peter Peterson, Faye Smith, Mike Petersen

Call to Order: Victor called the meeting to order at 6:34 PM.

Opening Prayer: Pastor Steve led the opening prayer.

Minutes of the Previous Meeting

It was noted that in the Comments of the Pastor section in the October council meeting minutes the word "monthly" was missing and should be added to ensure there is no confusion. The statement would then read "... and a decline in monthly giving to the building loan fund." A motion was made by Justin and seconded by Matt to accept the October council meeting minutes with the one change noted. Motion carried.

Financial Report and Approval of Bills

The council agreed to bring someone in to conduct a financial audit. It was noted this should occur at some frequency. It was believed the last time this was done was 4 to 5 years ago. Victor agreed to contact Huberty to have someone come in to discuss scope of the audit and cost.

Justin noted the transfer of funds into the General Fund that was approved by the council at last month's meeting did not occur yet and still needs to be completed.

Bobbi noted the beginning balance on the Abbreviated Financial Report for 10/1/23 doesn't match the 9/30/23 ending balance. This still needs to be corrected.

Justin reported he will be working on a voicing over on a video presentation of the 3rd quarter Investing in the Future (formerly Building to Serve) numbers. He will involve council members as needed. He reported the remaining balance on the building loan was \$665,178.77 as of 10/25/23.

A motion was made by Justin and seconded by Jerry to pay the bills and table the financial report approval until the errors are corrected. Motion carried.

In the Life of Our Church

Worship

The Thanksgiving Eve service is scheduled for Wednesday 11/22

Advent begins on Sunday 12/3. The church will be decorated on Saturday 12/2. Council members are encouraged to help.

The council discussed Christmas Eve services as there has been feedback received from some congregation members. The council agreed to hold a 9 AM service then hold a second service at 5 PM. It was noted that coffee hour would be held after each service. The Sunday School program would be held during the 5 PM service. A motion was made by Bobbi and seconded by Nancy to approve these changes to the schedule of the Christmas Eve services. Motion carried.

Pastor Steve shared some statistics on worship attendance and current membership age groups.

Pastor Steve shared an idea to hold a church dinner & discussion following the Annual Meeting. There will be more to come on this.

Christian Education: Still have low numbers.

Activities Assistant: No updates.

Groups in the Church Family

Ladies of Peace: Discussed Church of Peace Rummage Sale and dinner outing.

Marthas: Meeting tonight, no update.

Golden Fellowship: Meeting this Thursday to talk about making jewelry.

Youth: No update.

Outreach

Loaves & Fishes: No update.

Food Pantry: 24 households were given food assistance and 4 rent/utility assistance. Bobbi reminded the council about the Reverse Advent Calendar. The calendar and list of food items is set.

Pastor Steve mentioned that we will send a thank you card to Salem UCC in Wayne, WI for donating a large quantity of winter apparel for our Winter Clothing Rack.

Stewardship Ministry Team: Pastor Steve mentioned he is working on a letter to send out with the 3rd quarter statements. The council agreed that Investing in the Future should be included as well.

Church Administration

The council discussed the Pastor's medical and dental coverage and are now aligned. This coverage is detailed in the Pastor's call agreement.

Pastor Steve reported he has decided to take vacation the week after Christmas from 12/26/23 to 1/2/24.

The council agreed to deny a request by Healing 4 the Nations to use the building for meetings. The council discussed and agreed that we need to look into utilizing a new software program for accounting and church records. The current process is not sustainable.

Buildings and Grounds

Pastor Steve and Victor reported that 2 of the 3 new cameras have been installed and are working. The third camera designated for the elevator door is not working due to wi-fi issues. It was noted that we can add up to 3 more cameras if needed. Justin suggested asking the presenter coming in from Homeland Security to see if he has recommendations for camera position.

Scholarship Pinkert Fund:

The council discussed the idea of having a grant and scholarship. It was decided to table until the next council meeting so it can be discussed further to clear up confusion and set amounts for each.

Constitution review has been scheduled to take place after worship service on 1/7/24.

Investing in the Future (formerly Building to Serve): It was noted we have two investment groups awaiting a decision. The council agreed to stay with Wells Fargo due to various reasons. Justin will call to decline the services from the other groups at the current time.

- 1981 "Circus World Missions" with Saloah Hageman and Ginny Boyke sharing the chairmanship. They both dressed in Circus garb and we again featured quick breads.
- 1982 "Bazaar of Holidays" had Grace Keuther and Marge Sharkey leading us wearing different holiday attire and candy was featured.
- 1983 "Sounds of Christmas" and again Grace & Marge led us wearing white choir robes with red bows with our Christmas booth in the forefront.
- 1984 "Old-Fashioned Christmas" was chaired by Dorothy Whittaker and Vi Kryzanowski wearing white blouses with red ties and white caps. We made Homemade noodles to feature.
- 1985 "Peace" was our theme and Dorothy and Vi led us with the feature of Christmas recipe cards and wore red/green vest. The women's group New Dimensions made Noodle Angel ornaments.
- 1986 "Country Christmas" was the theme chaired by Judie Behnke and Jeanette Hinn featuring jams and jellies and noodle Angels.
